The New Seven Wonders of the World – Part 10 (Christ Redeemer Statue in Brazil)

This is part ten in a series of photo journals meant to document the imaginary trip around the world of the students of Wichita Collegiate School’s Early Childhood division. Through physical activity, they are visiting the “New Seven Wonders of the World” and the fourteen remaining finalists.



Rio de Janeiro, Brazil, is the location of the Christ Redeemer Statue that is one of the winners in the New Seven Wonders of the World competition. This giant concrete statue, finished in 1931, sits atop the Corcovado Mountain overlooking the city. Its open arms welcome visitors to the country. We learned that the Amazon River and the rain forest run through Brazil. We participated in a rainforest obstacle course. We caught tree frogs in scoops, jumped like jaguars, walked across the balance beam to avoid the snakes, crawled through caves, swung out over caiman crocodiles, climbed like monkeys, walked across stepping stones to avoid the quicksand, flew like butterflies, and navigated our way around the piranha in the Amazon River.
