Fire Safety Week

The gymnasium was the setting for some very important information as students learned about fire safety. After visiting the fire truck that came to our campus, students came to physical education where they continued to practice what to do if clothes are on fire, what to do if there is a house fire, planning an escape route in the house, and organizing a place to meet family if people should get separated. They were reminded that fire fighters are their friends and they should never hide during a fire.

Listed below are a few special rhymes that students learned to help them remember what to do.

1. No doubt, get out!
2. Use your clothes to cover you nose.
3. Get down to the ground.
4. Stay low and go.
5. Shout to get out!
6. Stop, drop, and roll!
7. Get it done, call 911!
